

Czech Republic - Prague

(5- Day Luxury Itinerary)

Where Gothic spires meet golden sunsets, and fine dining unfolds along the Vltava River. Explore cobbled streets, Baroque palaces, and Michelin-starred experiences in Europe's most enchanting city.

Day 1 – Arrival & Old Town Magic

- Arrive at Vaclav Havel Airport (PRG), private transfer to Four Seasons Hotel Prague (right by Charles Bridge, with panoramic castle views).
- Afternoon: wander through Old Town Square, admire the Astronomical Clock, and sip coffee at Café Mozart overlooking the plaza.
- Evening: welcome dinner at La Degustation Bohême Bourgeoise (Michelin-starred modern Czech cuisine) — a poetic introduction to Prague's gastronomy.
- Optional: night stroll to Charles Bridge for quiet reflections under the lanterns.

Day 2 – Prague Castle & Fine Dining

- Morning: visit Prague Castle Complex, including St. Vitus Cathedral and the Old Royal Palace.
- Lunch at Villa Richter, offering fine Czech flavors with vineyard views of the city.
- Afternoon: walk down to Mala Strana, explore St. Nicholas Church and Lesser Town Square.
- Evening: elegant dinner at Field Restaurant (Michelin-starred – farm-to-table concept with Nordic finesse).
- Optional: enjoy a late-night cocktail at Cloud 9 Sky Bar (Hilton Prague) overlooking the illuminated skyline.

Day 3 – Artistic Soul & Riverside Charm

- Breakfast at hotel terrace with river view.
- Visit Kampa Island and Museum Kampa, known for modern art and sculptures by David Černý.
- Lunch at CottoCrudo – modern Italian cuisine by the river, inside the Four Seasons.
- Afternoon: explore Josefov (Jewish Quarter) – history, synagogues, and quiet beauty.
- Evening: dinner cruise on the Vltava River aboard a luxury glass-roof boat – enjoy Prague's skyline as live jazz plays.

Day 4 – Day Trip to Karlovy Vary or Kutná Hora

- Option 1: Karlovy Vary – spa architecture, colonnades, Moser glass factory, and lunch at Grandhotel Pupp.
- Option 2: Kutná Hora – Gothic St. Barbara's Church and the surreal Bone Church (Sedlec Ossuary).
- Return to Prague in the evening.

- Dinner at Aromi – refined seafood and Italian dining.

Day 5 – Hidden Courtyards & Departure

- Leisurely breakfast and morning stroll through Vinohrady district – cafés, boutiques, and art-nouveau charm.
- Coffee at Café Savoy, an institution for pastries and people-watching.
- Last-minute shopping at Pařížská Street (Prague’s luxury boulevard).
- Private transfer to airport for departure.

Practical Travel Info

- Airport: Vaclav Havel (PRG), ~20 min from center.
- Transport: Walkable; trams and U-Bahn efficient.
- Best Time: April–June & September–October for mild weather.
- Plug Type: Type E (2-pin round).
- Currency: Czech Koruna (CZK).

Travel Tips & Essentials

- Book fine dining 2–3 weeks in advance.
- Comfortable walking shoes are essential for cobbled lanes.
- Exchange a small amount of cash for local cafés and trams.
- For photos: sunrise from Charles Bridge, sunset from Letná Park.



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Czech Republic - Grand Journey (10 Days / 9 Nights)

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From Prague's imperial grandeur to the fairy-tale charm of Český Krumlov and the spa opulence of Karlovy Vary, experience the Czech Republic in pure style. A curated blend of culture, cuisine, and castle-strewn countryside — designed for the discerning traveler.

Day 1 – Arrival in Prague

- Arrive at Vaclav Havel Airport (PRG). Private transfer to Four Seasons Hotel Prague (Old Town riverfront).
- Leisure time to settle in.
- Stroll along Charles Bridge and enjoy a sunset drink at CottoCrudo Bar & Lounge (in-house).
- Dinner at La Degustation Bohême Bourgeoise (Michelin-starred modern Czech tasting menu).

Day 2 – Classic Prague: Old Town, Castle & Culture

- Explore Old Town Square, Astronomical Clock, Jewish Quarter, and Charles Bridge.
- Lunch at Café Savoy – a Belle Époque institution.
- Afternoon visit to Prague Castle, St. Vitus Cathedral, and Golden Lane.
- Dinner at Field Restaurant (Michelin-starred, natural gourmet cuisine).
- Optional: nightcap at Cloud 9 Sky Bar with sweeping city views.

Day 3 – Modern Prague & Vinohrady Charm

- Breakfast at hotel.
- Discover Vinohrady & Letná districts — art cafés, design stores, and local galleries.
- Lunch at Eska (Michelin Bib Gourmand, modern Czech bakery & bistro).
- Afternoon free for shopping at Pařížská Street or Wenceslas Square.
- Dinner at Mlýnec, fine riverside dining overlooking Charles Bridge.

Day 4 – Day Trip to Karlovy Vary

- Drive (2 hrs) to Karlovy Vary, the spa town of Bohemian kings.
- Check in for a night at Grandhotel Pupp, an icon of European luxury.
- Visit Hot Springs Colonnade, Moser Glass Museum, and Diana Lookout Tower.

- Dinner at Le Marché by Jean Paul Georges, Karlovy Vary's top fine-dining address.

Day 5 – Karlovy Vary → Český Krumlov

- Scenic drive south (~4 hrs).
- Stop en route in Plzeň, home of the original Pilsner beer — lunch at Na Parkánu Brewery Restaurant.
- Arrive in Český Krumlov, check in at Hotel Ruze (historic monastery turned boutique hotel) or Hotel Bellevue.
- Stroll through medieval alleys and the riverside castle town.
- Dinner at Le Jardin, elegant Czech-French cuisine.

Day 6 – Český Krumlov Discovery

- Morning: visit Český Krumlov Castle, Castle Gardens, and Baroque Theatre.
- Afternoon: Vltava River rafting or art gallery exploration.
- Coffee at Monna Lisa Café.
- Dinner at Papilio Restaurant, a modern tasting menu experience in the heart of town.

Day 7 – Český Krumlov → Brno (Moravia)

- Morning departure to Brno, the youthful capital of South Moravia (~3 hrs).
- Check in at Barceló Brno Palace or Hotel Passage.
- Explore Špilberk Castle, Cathedral of St. Peter & Paul, and Freedom Square.
- Dinner at Pavillon Restaurant, contemporary Czech fine dining with elegant interiors.

Day 8 – Wine Trails of South Moravia

- Full-day private excursion to Lednice-Valtice UNESCO Landscape – castles, vineyards, and baroque gardens.
- Wine tasting and lunch at Sonberk Winery or Mikulov Estate.
- Return to Brno by evening.
- Dinner at KOISHI Fish & Sushi Restaurant, one of the Czech Republic's best seafood experiences.

Day 9 – Brno → Olomouc → Prague

- Drive to Olomouc (2 hrs) – a hidden gem of Moravia with baroque fountains and a UNESCO Holy Trinity Column.
- Lunch at Entrée Restaurant (Michelin Guide-listed modern gastronomy by chef Přemek Forejt).
- Afternoon return to Prague (~3 hrs).

- Check back into Four Seasons Prague or Andaz Prague for your final night.
- Farewell dinner at Aromi or The Artisan (inside Marriott Prague) – elegant, seasonal cuisine.

Day 10 – Departure

- Breakfast at leisure.
- Private transfer to Vaclav Havel Airport (PRG).
- End of journey — or extend your stay with a 3-day Vienna add-on (2.5 hrs by train).

Practical Travel Info

- Best Time to Visit: April–June or September–October (pleasant weather & fewer crowds)
- Currency: Czech Koruna (CZK)
- Electric Plug: Type E (2 round pins)
- Transport: Excellent train network + private transfers recommended
- Dress Code: Smart casual for fine dining; layers for spring/autumn

Travel Tips

- Reserve Michelin and fine dining restaurants 2–3 weeks in advance.
- Carry light cash for smaller towns and cafés.
- In Český Krumlov, early mornings are best for photos (before day-trippers arrive).
- In Brno and Olomouc, try local Moravian wines — crisp, aromatic, and underrated.
- Prague’s trams and metro are safe, reliable, and scenic.



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
